
..... Today we said farewell to 3 staff who are leaving for pastures new.

Albert has worked hard on his investigations, as have an increasing number of pupils (and parents!). The children will now have the Easter Holiday to complete these if they wish and the new date for the Non-Uniform will be on Friday 21st April.

Our school will benefit in funding if you meet the normal eligibility criteria for Free School Meals, so it is really important to us to make sure every child that meets the criteria is actually registered.

St John's Green is now able to check eligibility for Free School Meals using a simple, secure and confidential online process.

The criteria for eligibility is, if you are in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit 'run-on' (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

If you think you may be eligible, please ask for an application form at the school office.
