#### No 3-Affiliation: Joining in

Affiliation is the glue for healthy human functioning. It allows us to form and maintain relationships with others and to create something stronger, more adaptive and more creative than the individual.

Why it is important: human beings are social creatures. We are biologically designed to live, grow and work in groups. A family is a child's first and important group, glued together by the strong emotional bonds of attachment. But most other groups that children join, such as a pre-school class, children in the community and clubs are based on circumstances or common interests. It is here that they will have thousands of brief emotional and social experiences that will help shape their development.
